First, TURN ON AUTODEPOSIT !!!

AUTODEPOSIT is much more secure than using a Password to send and receive funds.



Some attendees of the Summer Picnic were asking about the answers for the Trivial Pursuit game. Well, here they are

Trivial Pursuit

Definition of Trivia: The common sense of the word refers not just to knowledge, but a particular kind of knowledge: obscure facts and details that aren't applicable to one's day-to-day life.

So here are some bits of trivia for you about Great Lakes and Canatara Park.

- 1. Ontario covers ONE million square kilometres. (Spain & France combined)
- 2. Ontario boasts approximately 250,000 lakes.
- 3. Ontario has 20 % of the world's freshwater stores.
- 4. Jewelry lovers will recognize what is the official stone of Ontario? Amethyst (largest supply 60 km east of Thunder Bay)
- 5. Name the 5 Great Lakes in area by order from largest to smallest. They are Superior, Huron, Michigan, Erie and Ontario
- 6. What happened in Lake Superior on November 10, 1975? Edmund Fitzgerald sank
- 7. What is the largest Canadian city on Lake Huron? Sarnia
- 8. What distinction does Lake Michigan have from the others? Located entirely in USA
- 9. Where does the name 'Sarnia' come from? Sir John Colborne named the township 'Sarnia' because it is the Latin name for Guernsey an island in the English Channel where he had been Governor before his appointment to Canada.

- 10. The first woman Lieutenant Governor of Ontario from Sarnia was *Pauline Emily Mills McGibbon (1910 2001)* served from 1974 to 1980 last visit to Sarnia in 1984 as Honorary Chairperson for <u>Kidney Foundation Sarnia</u>.
- 11. What Prime Minister of Canada was buried in Sarnia? Honorable Alexander McKenzie buried in Lakeview cemetery
- 12. Who named this park "Canatara"? *Maud McAdam Hanna widow of W.J. Hanna, (he at one time became President of Imperial Oil, was a Conservative MPP who became Secretary of Ontario.) Maud gave \$10K to the city to help buy the 1^{st} parcel of land, then bought property for the entranceway from Woodrowe Rd and also provided \$1,250 to buy Lake Chipican, or Little Lake. The park was created in 1933

She gave Canatara its name, borrowing an Ojibwa word for blue water.

- 13. How long is the beach in Canatara Park? 1 kilometer
- 14. Canatara Beach is 1 of only 27 in Canada to have earned official BLUE FLAG status for its commitment to strict water quality.
- 15. What years did the Bluewater bridges open? First one started 1936, open 1938 and 2^{nd} one started 1992 and open 1997
- 16. Can you walk or bike across the bridges to the US? No, No, cannot do either
